1. Introduction

On September 5, 2019, the Antis Township Board of Supervisors expressed interest to explore a coal/coal waste pile located in Antis Township Blair County (Figure 1). Having evaluated the expression of interest, the Township is herein issuing a Request for Bids (RFB) to explore the coal/coal waste pile, and possibly remove, in the area shown in Figure 2, which is defined as the Project Area.

2. Background

The project area contains known above ground coal material where a known plant (Kerbaugh Plant) existed in the early 1900s. The site is also in close proximity to a major rail line and rail spurs exist in project area. Based on composites of sampling (4 samples taken at eight-foot depths at different locations), the material sampled averaged 0.49% sulfur and 40.03% ash, and 6,090 BTU/lb as received. Project area is approximately 21 acres.

3. <u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of this RFB is to seek exploration/reclamation proposals from proponents interested in removing the coal resource contained within the Project Area and restoring the Project Area as desired by the Township. More specifically, upon removal of all coal waste, the successful bidder will restore the site to a condition of unmanaged natural habitat along with some tree buffer areas.

It is anticipated that a contract could be awarded within 60 days of the bid opening, with the expectation that the successful bidder would begin the DEP Government Funded Construction Contract (GFCC) process immediately and that reclamation work would begin upon issuance of a GFCC by DEP and be completed in no more than three years.

Applicants submitting bids are required to investigate and report how potential constraints will affect the Project Area.

Township reserves the right to reject any and all bids and in its sole discretion to waive or refuse to waive any formalities or errors in the bids.

4. Bidder Obligations

Each potential bidder must obtain a copy of the bid packet from the Township Office and must register with the Township by providing an individual contact person's name and contact information. Registered bidders will be provided notice of any updates to the bid specifications and will be invited to any pre-bid meetings. Only registered bidders may submit bids.

Each potential bidder must perform at its own expense test borings or any other exploration work necessary to determine the volume and quality of the coal waste on the Project Site. A copy of all test results must be submitted with the bid, as demonstration that the bidder completed such work.

Successful bidder must demonstrate that it successfully has completed multiple (GFCC) Projects of this nature, involving coal and/or coal waste projects and related environmental reclamation, with the PA Department of Environmental Protection. All permits and other approvals, as well as administration of the GFCC will be the sole responsibility of the Successful Bidder.

All bidders must attend any mandatory pre-bid meetings, which will be scheduled by

6. Submission of Bids

Three (3) copies of the bid proposal should be sent to the attention of the Antis Township Manager, Lucas Martsolf. Bids must be submitted in person to the Antis Township Municipal Government office located at 909 North Second Street, Bellwood, PA 16617, by 3 pm local time, November 1, 2019. Bids received after the closing date and time will not be considered. Bids sent by other means will not be accepted.

7. Bid Proposal Content and Format

Each bid must include the following information:

- a) Company and Project Management
- b) Technical Management Team
- c) Knowledge of Regulatory Approval Process
- d) Exploration Plan Each bidder must obtain a Notice of Intent To Explore (ITE) Permit from DEP prior to testing of the site. With the bid submission, bidder must demonstrate compliance with this requirement, along with a copy of the permit application materials and any evidence that bidder has complied with such permit. The Exploration Plan submitted with the bid also shall contain the following discussion of anticipated aspects of the Project.
 - i. Coal resource evaluation
 - ii. Exploration program
 - iii. Land access

- iv. Project schedule
- v. Environmental management plan
- vi. Reclamation approach
- e) Statement of Project Impacts and Benefits
- f) Statement of Past Practice in Coal Mining and/or Reclamation (Including references)
- g) Pricing/Royalties communicated as a price per ton.
