The April 2, 2026 Board of Supervisors meeting was called to order at 6:00 by George Bell followed by prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment Period

There were no public comments.

Meeting Minutes

The March 5, 2026 Board of Supervisor meeting minutes were approved on the motion of Susan Kensinger, seconded by Steve Winterstein followed by a 5-0 voice vote.

Supervisors Reports

George Bell reported that the trail is well utilized.

Sue Kensinger reported on the library's book sale.

Brian Kustaborder reported that the Altoona Water Authority is planning to install additional fire hydrants in the area of Tipton to Pinecroft.

Solicitor's Report

Patrick Fanelli provided an update on the decertification of Pinecroft Volunteer Fire Company. He reported that the Board adopted a resolution at last month's meeting to decertify the fire company and in response the Fire Company filed an injunction. The Township received notice earlier in the day that the Court ruled that the Township's preliminary objections are sustained and the complaint has been dismissed with the injunction by the fire company dissolved.

Manager's Report

The Manager reported that the Steering Committee for the Comprehensive Plan are reviewing the survey results and hopes to draft a plan before the end of the year.

Code Enforcement Report

Shawn reported that the property in Riggles Gap that was slated to be red tagged is working with Luke Helsel to bring the septic system into compliance.

Engineer's Report

On the motion of Supervisor Kustaborder, seconded by Supervisor Kensinger followed by a 4-0 voice approval was given to the waiver request for fencing around a retention pond for the Jeffrey Fink property given there is an indemnification agreement with the township.

Planning Commission

On the motion of Supervisor Kustaborder seconded by Supervisor Kensinger followed by a 4-0 voice vote the time given to review the J-Rae Land Development was extended indefinitely.

Treasurer Reports

The March 2026 Treasurers Report was approved on the motion of Supervisor Winterstein, seconded by Supervisor Kustaborder followed by a 4-0 roll call vote.

Bills in the amount of \$36, 257.37 from the General Fund, \$4,490.37 from the Capital Reserve Fund, were approved for payment on the motion of Supervisor Bell Seconded by Supervisor Kustaborder followed by a 4-0 roll call vote.

Authorization was given on the motion of Supervisor Bell, seconded by Supervisor Winterstein followed by a 4-0 voice vote to transfer \$126,068.94 in first quarter EIT to the Capital reserve Fund.

On the motion of Supervisor Winterstein Seconded by Supervisor Kensinger followed by a 4-0 voice vote authorization was given to transfer \$20K from the General Fund to the Stormwater Improvement Fund.

On the motion of Supervisor Winterstein Seconded by Supervisor Kensinger followed by a 4-0 voice vote authorization was given and to release \$11,474.17 to the Conservation District for our contribution to the ISC.

Authorization was given to release half of our contribution to the library in the amount of \$19,294, on the motion of Supervisor Kustaborder, seconded by Supervisor Kensinger followed by a 4-0 voice vote.

New Business

The sealed bids for the aggregate material were opened at 4:00 on April 2nd with no bidders present.

A motion to award the Aggregate Material Bid to New Enterprise Stone & Lime who submitted the low bid of \$80,460 was made by Supervisor Bell, seconded by Supervisor Kustaborder by a 4-0 vote. The bid tabulation is made part of these minutes.

On the motion of Supervisor Kustaborder, seconded by Supervisor Kensinger followed by a 4-0 voice vote authorization was given to accept the proposal for lawn care submitted by Carter's Lawn care.

On the motion of Supervisor Kustaborder seconded by Supervisor Bell followed by a 4-0 voice vote, authorization was given to execute the Blair YMCA contract for pool management.

On the motion of Supervisor Bell seconded by supervisor Kustaborder followed by a 4-0 voice vote authorization was given to purchase a street sweeper for a trade of the loader sweeper attachment valued at \$14,000 and \$26,000 cash.

On the motion of Supervisor Kustaborder seconded by Supervisor Kensinger followed by a 4-0 voice vote authorization was given to advertise the Dirt & Gravel Project.

On the motion of Supervisor Bell seconded by Winterstein followed by a 4-0 voice vote authorization was given to release half of our annual contribution in the amount of \$47,735 to the Excelsior Fire Company.

On the motion of Supervisor Kustaborder seconded by Supervisor Winterstein followed by a 4-0 voice vote authorization was given to place the following items on Municibid:
Altec Milling machine, NPK Hydro Hammer, NPK Compactor, Koehler Generator, Loader and backhoe spare tires.

Public Comment Period

Gary Forshey reported on his continued concern over the amount of the tax collectors pay and reimbursement for the tax collection software. Supervisor Kensinger responded that the tax collector is responsible for the costs of setting up the tax office including the software.
